Haslemere Minor Injury Unit (MIU)

What do we do?

Our team of skilled Nurse Practitioners are registered nurses with extended qualification and experience in assessment, examination, diagnosis and treatment of patients with minor injuries. If we are unable to help, we can refer or direct you to the most appropriate service.

Who can we see?

The MIU is for adults and children **over the age of two years**.

What facilities are available?

- X-Ray
- Application of Plaster casts/splints

(For patients diagnosed and treated in the Unit)

What we treat

For adults and children over the age of two years;

- Bites and stings
- Wounds – cuts, bruises and grazes
- Minor burns and scalds
- Muscle and joint injuries – strains, sprains and suspected limb fractures
- Sports injuries
- Minor eye injuries
- Minor head injuries (with NO loss of consciousness)
- Removal of foreign bodies from ears, eyes or nose
- Removal of splinters
- Local skin or wound infections
- Minor injuries to back, ribs, shoulder and chest
- Tetanus immunisations after injuries
- Low impact road traffic accidents
- Removal of rings, earrings and studs

What we are unable to treat

- Allergic reactions
- Asthma
- Breathing difficulties
- Earache/colds, coughs, flu and chest infections
- Mental health problems
- Pregnancy related problems
- Injuries that require a neck, chest or back x-ray
- Serious injuries
- Severe chest pain
- Sore throat
- Stomach pain
- Vomiting and diarrhoea
- Overdoses
- Alcohol related problems
- Toothache
- Old/on-going injuries
